About which years of books are in the Public Domain:

- Books published in the U.S. **BEFORE 1923** will be in the public domain
- Books published starting in **1923 and up to and including 1963** MIGHT be in the public domain if their copyright was not renewed 28 years later.

Do NOT “assume” that a book is automatically in the public domain just because you found it online – except for U.S. published books BEFORE 1923.

In Google Books, you are not going to find many full-text public domain books published between 1923 and 1963.

I really enjoy finding public domain books that aren't even found online – and are much newer than the books we'll find here on google. I can show you step-by-step how to find them too!

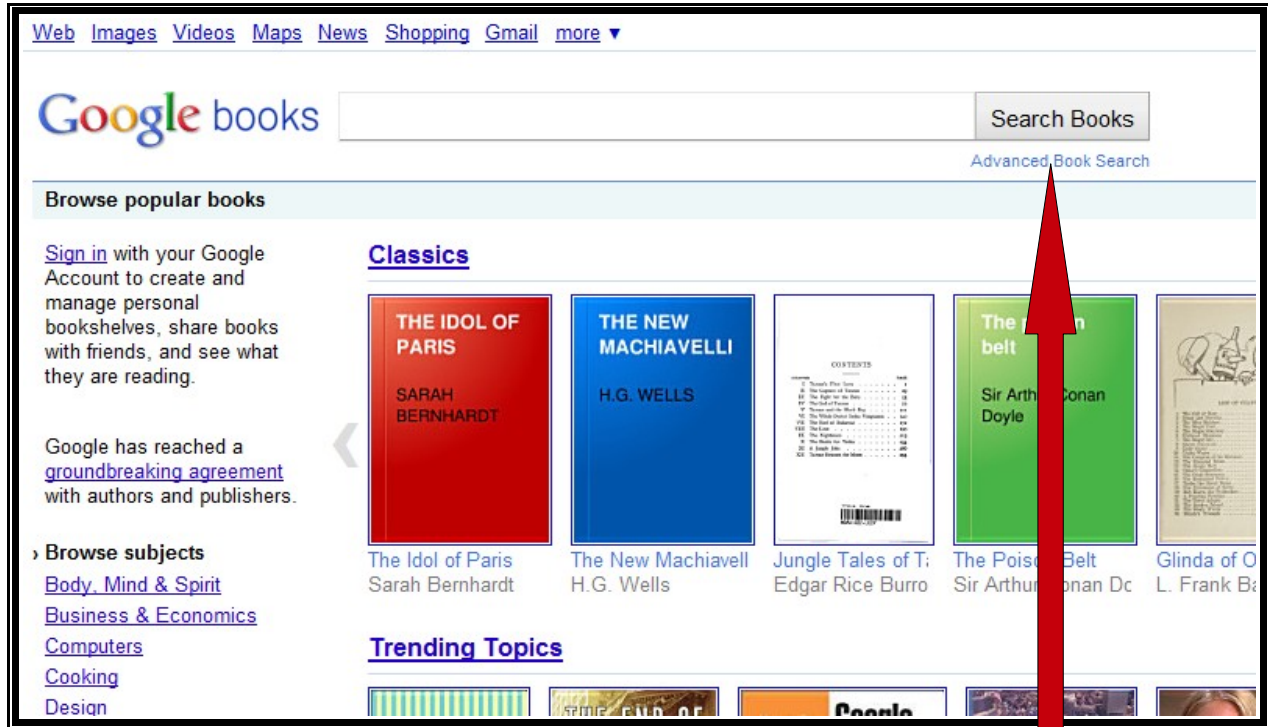
For instance, I recently found a book from the 1960's with step-by-step instructions about painting (portraits, flowers, landscape...etc.) written by a well known painter.

Go to: www.Google.com/books



Just under the “Search Books” button you'll see a link for “Advanced Search” - click on that, or you can go directly to it here: http://books.google.com/advanced_book_search

Advanced Search:

You'll then come to the "Advanced Book Search Page" which looks like this:

First we'll set the "Search" to "Full View Only" and "Content" to "Books, like this:

Setting the Publication Dates we want to look for

What we're going to want to do is only search for books within certain years that we know are in the public domain.

We're going to set the date limits as follows:

Go down towards the bottom of the page where it says "Publication Date" click on the little circle next to "Return Content published between."

And then on the right, put in the following dates: Jan 1800 and Dec 1923

Like this:



Publication Date

Return content published anytime

Return content published between

Jan 1800 and Dec 1923

e.g. 1999 and 2000, or Jan 1999 and Dec 2000

If you want to, experiment with setting the end date to Dec 1963 and see what is found.

But, again, be aware that :


- Books published starting in **1923 and up to and including 1963 MIGHT** be in the public domain if their copyright was not renewed 28 years later.

Do NOT "assume" that a book is automatically in the public domain just because you found it online – except for U.S. published books BEFORE 1923.

Entering Search Terms

You should already have some keywords/niches you want to focus on. For the purpose of this example we're going to search for "golf".

In the "Find Results" section up top, type in "golf" and click on "Google Search" like this:
